March 18, Chapter Meeting 7PM Wildflowers, Birds, and Nature Kids with Carolyn Sevier

There is growing recognition among bird enthusiasts of the importance of native plants to bird habitat, but how many of us are able to identify the native plants that share our spaces? In this presentation, Carolyn Sevier will outline the basics of field identification of native plants as well as provide examples of common native plants and the variety of habitat types in Yellowstone County. She will also discuss how the education programs at the Montana Audubon Center use connection to these plants and habitats in their efforts to connect more than 8,000 kids each year with nature -- an increasingly critical task in our screens-and-schedules driven world.

Carolyn Sevier is Director of the Montana Audubon Center, an education program of Montana Audubon based in Billings. She has been in outdoor education and non-profit work for more than 20 years, having spent time roaming and teaching in the lodgepole forests and sagebrush deserts of Idaho, the Continental Divide country near Helena, and for the last ten years the grasslands and riparian areas of Billings. She is an instructor in the Montana Master Naturalist program and lives in Billings with her husband, three small children, and whatever birds will come to their backyard feeders.

Osprey Platform

2019 marks Yellowstone Valley Audubon Society's 10th year of monitoring Osprey nests and recording data along the Yellowstone, Stillwater and Big Horn Rivers. From Gardiner to Miles City, over 40 monitors faithfully observe nests with a focus on recording data and identifying banded Ospreys. Some of our members have been involved in the project since it first took root in 2009. **Without our volunteers, this project would not be possible!**

The annual YVAS Osprey Orientations are scheduled for the following three locations: Billings, Livingston and Miles City. Dr. Marco Restani will be discussing Osprey history, biology and ecology and reviewing recording procedures for the data. It is recommended that all nest monitors attend especially if you are new to the project. These programs are free and open to anyone interested in learning more about Ospreys, however, an **RSVP** is requested.
